No Beauty in Public Art Master Plan

Buried in the middle of Arlington’s draft Public Art Master Plan were a number of attempts to suppress the Green Valley community and rewrite our historical narrative. The document was rife with falsehoods and inaccuracies regarding Green Valley. As stated by the GVCA Executive Committee, “the errors were repetitive, disgraceful and opaque.”

The county board, at its November 13, 2021, meeting, made many of the corrections requested by GVCA. Yet, errors remain, including attempts to ignore a seminal report on the arts and industry district.

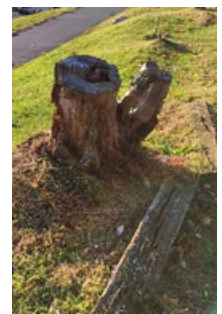
