







WHAT IS THE NEIGHBORHOOD CONSERVATION PROGRAM (NC)?

The Arlington County Neighborhood Conservation Program (1964)


- improve and enhance Arlington neighborhoods
- empower residents to share ideas for improving their neighborhoods
- provides funding for a variety of improvements including:
- **□**sidewalks
- curbs and gutters
- streetlights
- **□**signs
- park improvements, and
- beautification
- Becomes part of a larger community known as the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee (NCAC)
- The County Board relies on the NCAC to report on the issues of greatest concern in our community members
- Community NC reps serve on the NCAC and help to develop recommendations for improving the neighborhood conservation process.
